

## Attachment A: Annual Public Notice of Career-Technical Education Opportunities

[1979 Guidelines IV\(O\)](#), requires subrecipients to **annually issue public notification** that all career-technical education opportunities will be offered without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, sex, gender identity, age or disability. Several requirements encompass an acceptable notice.

This notification shall:

- Be made prior to the beginning of each school year.
- Advise students, parents/guardians, employees and the general public of the policy of non-discrimination.
- Contain an assurance that the lack of English language skills will not be a barrier to admission and participation in career-technical education programs.
- Be disseminated to communities of national origin minority persons with limited English language skills in their native language.
  - If posted on a school website, the notice must be translated or be able to be electronically translated to the languages spoken at home for English learner student groups in the school or district.
  - If posted as a paper copy in print or in a publication, the annual notice must be translated to the languages spoken at home for English learner student groups in the school or district.
- Provide a list and brief summary of programs or course offerings.
- Provide a brief summary of admissions criteria for each program or course.
- Provide the name and title, office address and telephone number of the person(s) designated to coordinate Title IX, Section 504 and Age compliance.

Local newspapers, school websites, school newsletters, bulletins, memoranda, other publications and other media are suggested ways for providing this notification. If the annual notice is posted on a school or district website, it must be accessible within two clicks of the home page.
